A guide to your cabin and our services

Whether you've cruised before or you're completely new to it, here's everything you need to know to get up to speed with TUI Aria.

Ship info

Onboard Ship Account

We operate a cashless system on board. Everything you purchase will be charged to your onboard account. You can register your credit or debit card during the first five days of your sailing.

Going Ashore

When leaving the ship to go ashore, you'll need to collect your shore card from reception and hand it back in when you return. This is so we know who is on and off the ship at all times. Before you leave, please take note of the 'all onboard' time, which can be found on the digital screens in reception, on the doors as you exit the ship, as well as in Navigate.

Reflections

Swim, dine and drink at Reflections. It serves as the pool during the day - complete with retractable roof for year-round dips, plus seating around the edge and a sauna. Then, when evening comes around the floor closes over the pool and Italian-style bites are on the menu. There's occasional evening entertainment, too, including live music.

Toilet System

The flushing system used onboard is a vacuum type and is extremely sensitive. Do not discard any bulky objects into the toilet, including facial wipes, sanitary items, moist toilet wipes or excessive amounts of toilet paper. Disposal of items other than small amounts of toilet paper will damage and block the toilet system.

Departure Information

You'll need to vacate your cabins by 9am. This is so our housekeeping team can prepare the cabins for our arriving guests. If you've booked the Little Extras package, you can stay in your cabin until 11am.

Cabin info

Safety deposit boxes

Every cabin comes with a safety deposit box to store your valuables. They're free to use.

TV

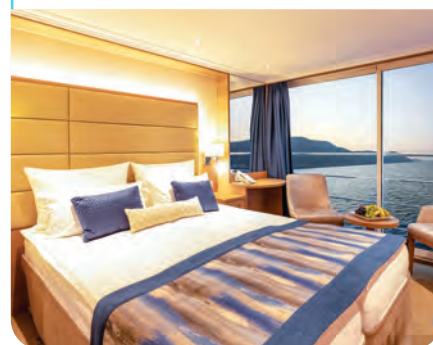
When the ship arrives in port, it'll switch to the local power supply. When doing so, your TV might turn off for a few minutes. Don't worry, it's not broken, so you don't need to report this.

Telephone

You can use your cabin phone to call Reception - you'll see a pre-set button on the handset. If you want to call another cabin, just dial the cabin number.

Mobile phones

Depending on your mobile phone provider, your phone should work throughout your sailing. International roaming rates might apply, and prices are set by your operator.

Speak to your Cruise Director if you have any questions while you're onboard. Look out for the port showcase at the start of your sailing and the daily port talks, as well.



Services

Reception

Reception's open 24/7, so you can visit them on Deck 2 or call them on your cabin phone by pressing the pre-set 'Reception' button.

Onboard Shop

You can buy branded TUI River Cruises merchandise onboard.

Housekeeping

Cabin stewards will visit once a day to make sure everything's spick-and-span. If you'd prefer not to have housekeeping visit your cabin, then just pop the 'Do not disturb' sign on your door.

Laundry

To use our laundry service, simply request a bag from Reception. Place your items in the bag, then fill out the laundry slips - where you'll find prices for each item. Once you're finished, contact Reception, who will arrange for your bag to be collected. Just so you know,

we don't accept laundry the day before disembarkation, as we can't guarantee it'll be ready before you leave.

Navigate

Our Navigate app is your one-stop-shop for everything river cruise related - and it's completely free to use. All you need is a smartphone, a tablet, or a laptop.

- Once you've registered your device for Wi-Fi, you'll be directed to the Navigate home page. If this doesn't happen, you can type navigate.tui into your web browser.
- To access your onboard bill, you'll need to scan your passport at reception, and you'll then be prompted to use your name and date of birth on Navigate.



Wi-Fi

There's free Wi-Fi access throughout the ship - speeds and coverage may vary.

Safety info



Moving Around The Ship

Unlike a hotel, a ship can move around unexpectedly, so take care when walking around the ship and its stairwells. Please use the handrails when you can and take extra care when walking through doors, as they might be heavier than you're used to with a raised lip to step over. You'll also need to take care when walking around the top deck, as it can become slippery when wet. Don't sit, climb or stand on the handrails. And avoid putting your hands or head over the side of the ship when coming in and out of the port, passing through locks and under bridges, or when opening your cabin window.



Muster Station

Your muster station is a safe location, where you need to gather in an emergency. It's located on the top deck and is where you'll find life jackets. You can find directions for the quickest route to your muster station on the back of your cabin door.



Electrical Items

Please take care when using electrical items in your cabin. And don't leave appliances charging when you're not in your cabin, as it's a fire risk. Please don't use electric blankets and water heaters brought from home, since the ship's outlets are only 220 volts. Also, note that the sockets in the bathroom are for shavers only.



Medical Equipment

If you have any special medical needs and require the use of a sharps box or medical bin, just let Reception or your Cruise Director know when you arrive and they'll make arrangements for you. For the safety of our crew, please don't dispose of any medical needles in the general waste bins.



Smoking Policy

Smoking and vaping is only allowed in designated smoking areas, which can be found on the top deck. Please don't move ashtrays into other areas - we want all our guests to have a space where they're comfortable, whether they smoke or not. Any guests found to be smoking in their cabin will be charged for a deep clean to freshen the cabin for future guests.



Health & Sanitation

Please use the hand sanitisers positioned around the ship as often as possible. If you begin to feel unwell at any point, please return to your cabin and call reception.



Tap Water

The tap water's safe to drink, and due to international standards, is chlorinated. You can get your water bottle topped up at the bar while you're onboard, too.

Emergency signal

In the event of an emergency, you'll probably hear several signals and alarms. If you hear this signal, you should stay calm and do the following...

- 01 If you're in your cabin, collect something warm to wear and any prescribed medication, then head straight to your muster station.
- 02 If you're not in your cabin, go straight to your muster station.

- 03 If there's smoke in the corridor, stay as low to the ground as possible - the air is clearer here and the lighting will be easier to see.



You'll find further information on what to do during an emergency on the safety channel of your cabin's TV. If you've got any questions, please speak to Reception or your Cruise Director.

Navigate life onboard

It's easy to find our restaurant opening times, entertainment schedules, or your most up-to-date bill - just use our free onboard app, Navigate. Here's how it works...

What is Navigate?

It's our free onboard app, which you can use to find out anything you need to know about your cruise - whether it's opening times, entertainment programmes, the weather forecast, or the following day's port. You can also use it to view your onboard account, or leave feedback.

What can I use it for?

- Check your most up-to-date bill on your onboard account
- See the day's entertainment schedule
- Find out the opening times of onboard bars and restaurants
- View details on the next day's port, schedule and weather forecast
- View maps and information about each port
- Leave feedback on your dining and entertainment experience
- View the daily menus for the restaurants
- Find out about our special events onboard, including our 5th birthday celebrations.



How can I access it?

Navigate is free to use. All you need is a smartphone, a tablet or a laptop. Once you're connected to the ship's Wi-Fi, Navigate will automatically open up.

For easy access, we recommend saving the app to your home screen, where possible. Alternatively, you can go to your browser, and type in 'navigate.tui'.



We want to hear from you

We're committed to making sure our river cruises are the best they can be, so we'd love to hear what you think. You can leave feedback about all aspects of our cruises - from the dining and the entertainment to the onboard activities - on our app, Navigate.

And, if there's anything that doesn't immediately meet your expectations, please speak to one of our crew, your onboard Cruise Director, or pop to reception - they'll be able to help.

All inclusive drinks package

Get all your drinks thrown in outside of mealtimes, from premium coffees to classic cocktails. Please note, you'll need to do this during your first day onboard.

Wine or Prosecco in your cabin

Treat yourself to a bottle of wine or Prosecco served on ice, in your cabin.

Breakfast & bubbles package

Treat yourself to breakfast in bed, with a Continental breakfast and a bottle of Prosecco.



Celebration package

Celebrating a special occasion? Or just fancy treating yourself? Either way, our Celebration package should hit the spot. It includes Continental breakfast in bed, a bottle of Prosecco in your cabin and a card from the Cruise Director.

Little extras package

This package takes a handful of top-notch extras and rolls them up into one big bundle. You'll get Prosecco and chocolates in your cabin, a behind-the-scenes-tour with our Cruise Director, and a later cabin check out on your last day.

A taste of Europe

You don't need to go ashore for some European flavour, our onboard restaurants and bars serve seasonal dishes and regional wines, too. Take a look at where you can drink and dine onboard.



Verdastro

The menu changes daily at our main waiter service restaurant, which is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. It's made up of fresh, seasonal produce, sourced from local suppliers. You can pick from the likes of sea bream, tortellini and lamb shank.



Reflections

Italian-style bites are on the menu here in the evenings, plus occasional evening entertainment.



Observatory

At the heart of the ship, you'll find Observatory, where the evening entertainment takes place. Kick back in the comfy seats and admire the views through the floor-to-ceiling windows, then enjoy live music, local acts, interactive quizzes and more.





Upgrade to All Inclusive

All our European ships are Full Board Plus as standard, which means you get tea, coffee, soft drinks, wine or beer with meals. There's the option of house white, red or rosé wine at lunch and dinner, or you can try the specially selected wine from the region at dinnertime.

Any other drinks need to be paid for, or you can upgrade to All Inclusive. This way, you'll get a wider selection of drinks included, like draught beers, branded spirits, cocktails and premium-brand coffee.

Upgrades apply to all guests in each cabin.



Dress Code

During the day, the dress code's pretty relaxed, then come evening, things get a little smarter. Items like long trousers smart tailored shorts, shirts and polo shirts are fine, but it's best to leave the sportswear and vests in your cabin.



Afternoon tea

Afternoon tea is served once per cruise on sailings of five nights or more, where a variety of sweet and savoury items are on the cards. Tea, coffee and cake are served daily, too.



Dietary Requirements

If you've got any dietary requirements, just let us know when you arrive and we'll set up a meeting with the maitre d'.



Gala Dinner

There's a six-course gala dinner - plus petit fours - on our sailings which are five nights or longer. You can get your glad rags on, too, if you like, but there's no obligation to dress up.



Look out for some special festive dishes on our Christmas and New Year sailings.



Local Eats

From waffles to strudel - here's a pair of **sweet treats** you can tick off en route...

Stroopwafel

Unlike a typical fluffy Belgian waffle, this Dutch variety is a thin and crunchy wafer cookie, filled with a caramel syrup. Locals put it on top of their tea to warm it up.

Strudel

Layers of crispy pastry are wrapped around sweet fillings in this Austrian pudding. Apple - or apfelstrudel, as the locals say - is the most popular.

And if you're joining us on a festive sailing, here are a couple of seasonal specials to look out for...

Bethmannchen

Marzipan dough gives these cookies their distinctive flavour. Locals in Frankfurt have been baking them since 1838, and during the festive period you'll find them in just about every chocolate shop or bakery in town.

Glühwein

Things don't get more Christmassy than glühwein, AKA mulled wine. This traditional German drink - made with red wine and spices - is a great way to warm up while wandering the market stalls.

*Premium-brand coffee isn't included as part of the Full Board Plus package. You'll need to upgrade to the All Inclusive drinks package, or pay extra.

Pick your pace onboard

Exploring ashore's not the only option with TUI River Cruises. There's an AM to PM programme of entertainment to keep you busy in between.

Day

Whether you want to keep fit, join a tournament or get crafty, our daytime timetable lets you do it all. Check out Navigate for our entertainment schedule.



Wellness

Get your muscles moving at a Yoga session, dance, or stretch class



Downtime

Watch a movie at the Observatory, use the digital games table in the Club Lounge, curl up with a book from our little library, play cards or delve into our board games. You can also check out our destination podcasts, listen to your Cruise Director's commentary as you sail past iconic locations, and try our E-puzzlers - these online games include the likes of wordsearches.



Local lingo

Pick up some key phrases from the destinations you visit with our language classes.



Games

You can try the likes of minigolf, quoits - which is like ring toss - and sjoelbak - a type of shuffleboard.



Night

In the evening, there's a whole host of nightly entertainment in the Observatory, including lively shows from our entertainment team - some with a festive theme.



Musical shows

Sing and dance along to familiar favourites at our musical shows. We've got some new ones for 2026, too.



Quizzes and silent discos

Our interactive gameshows and quizzes feature the latest technology, like buzzers, 'fastest finger first' and LED screens. There's jukebox bingo, too, where songs replace numbers. And, don't forget our old favourite - the silent disco.



Vocal performances

Our entertainment team provide the soundtrack each evening with a variety of popular hits.



Local guest acts

You'll be entertained by a range of local guest acts, including dancers and singers.



If you're sailing with us over the festive period, look out for our themed activities, like Christmas movies, Christmas jumper competitions and festive quizzes.

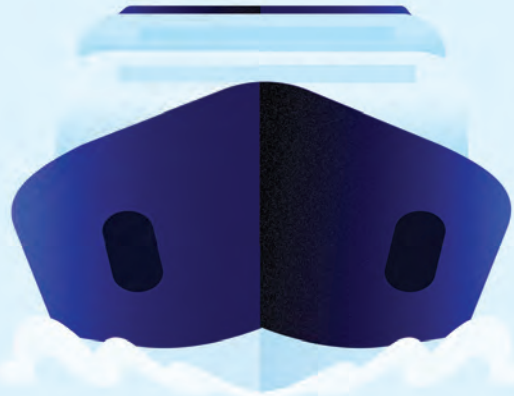

Low Bridges

We have to pass under bridges on some of our sailings, so sometimes the top deck will be out of use for periods of time while it's collapsed.

Cruise with a conscience

Ever wonder what we're doing to reduce the environmental impact of our sailings?

Here are some of the things we do to keep the waterways beautiful and help local communities, plus a few ways you can lend a hand, too....

What we're doing

We've cut down on single-use plastic water bottles. Instead, you'll find reusable bottles in your cabin, which you can keep. There are refill stations onboard, too.

We use recycled materials. Some of the carpets around TUI Isla, TUI Maya and TUI Skyla are made from recycled fishing nets.

No more plastic straws or bags. We've said goodbye to plastic straws in our drinks and replaced them with paper ones. Plus, our packed lunches are provided in cardboard boxes rather than plastic bags.

Local guides. Most of our shore experiences are delivered by locally-employed guides, which supports the local economy.

Local acts. Our evening entertainment is provided by local acts at least three times per week.

Less paper. You'll find Cruise News on TV screens around the ship, and on our Navigate app rather than in paper form.

You can read a digital version of this magazine and our brochures, too.

Cleaner rivers. We're preventing untreated sewage from entering rivers on our European fleet, thanks to our advanced membrane bioreactor type sewage treatment plant. Plus, we use Ecolab laundry detergent, which prevents harmful chemicals from entering waterways.

Reuse. We reuse all our Christmas decorations, and we sell reusable tote bags and Christmas mugs on our European fleet.

Stay cool. We use reflective window foil on TUI Isla, which keeps the ship cooler, reduces our use of air-conditioning and reduces our fuel consumption.

Reduced emissions. Our European fleet have onshore power supply capability, which is used wherever it's available. This means emissions are zero while we're docked at some ports.

Reduced water usage. We have vacuum toilets onboard, which reduces water consumption.

We're all for charity. During the refurbishment of our ships, we donate all the old furniture to local charities.

Responsible. From the uniforms our crew wear to the linens and textiles in your cabin, we use responsibly-sourced fabrics that prioritise people and the planet.



Reducing food waste.

We've installed special equipment in the galley to determine the amount of food waste and reduce it.



Reduced electricity usage

Our LED lights use less electricity and reduce our fuel consumption.



Awards and recognition

Last but not least, our commitment to reducing our environmental impact has been recognised with a few awards. TUI Isla and TUI Maya have picked up a Silver Green Award, while TUI Skyla has picked up a Bronze Green Award. And, we're signed up to the Sustainable Maritime Interiors Declaration, which means we pledge to design, build, and maintain ship interiors with sustainability in mind.



What you can do

Buy locally made products. It's an easy way to support a local community. Plus, items that are flown or shipped in from overseas have a much larger carbon footprint.

Hang up your towels. By doing this, you're letting our crew know you don't need your towels to be washed every day.

Try a few vegetarian meals. While you're onboard or out and about, try veggie-based dishes instead of meat - meat produces higher levels of greenhouse gas emissions.

Use apps and online confirmation for bookings. This means you can save on paper. And if you do use tourist maps or brochures, leave them behind for the next person to use, to save on more printing.

Eat like a local. Avoid eating at restaurant chains and instead, visit markets, local neighbourhoods or street vendors for your foodie needs.



Recycle.

You'll find a couple of recycling stations onboard in the public areas.

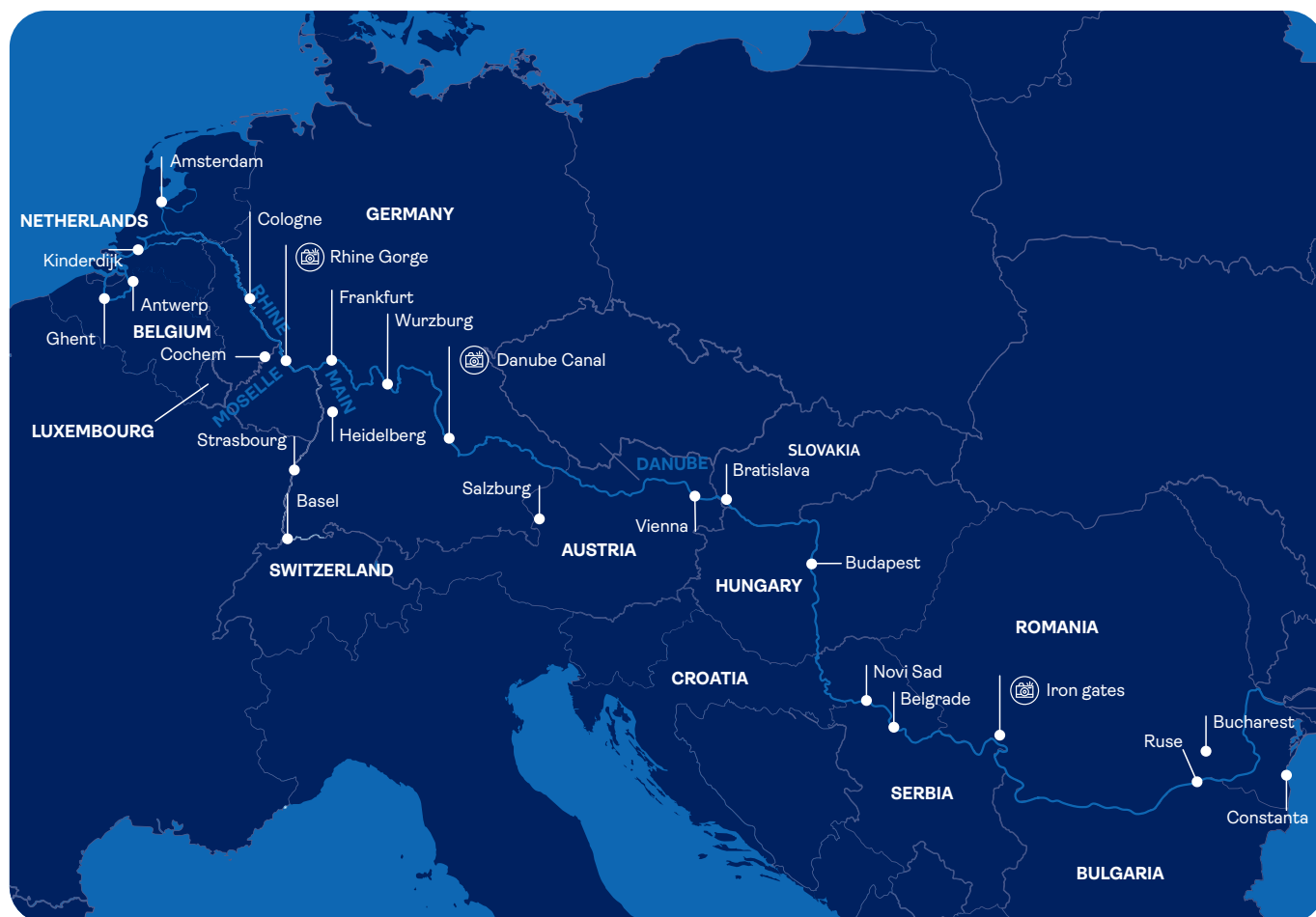
Caring for our world

Here's a look at the places you can go...

Rhine

On its journey from the Alps to the North Sea, the Rhine ticks off cities and vineyard-backed villages. Plus, the Rhine Gorge is home to more castles than any other valley in the world.

Moselle

Wine, wine and more wine - that's the name of the game along the Moselle. First-class Rieslings grow in terraced vineyards, making the views just as good as the vino.

See Germany at its prettiest on a Main river cruise. You'll have the chance to hop off at castle-crowned cities and villages full of timber-framed houses.

Danube

Europe's second-longest river flows through 10 countries. It also passes four grand capitals - Budapest, Vienna, Bratislava and Belgrade - which you can visit on our itineraries.

Douro

Running across the entire width of northern Portugal, this leggy river goes straight through the oldest recognised wine region in the world - the UNESCO-ticked Douro Valley.



Nile

Leopold Museum Vienna - skip-the-line tickets

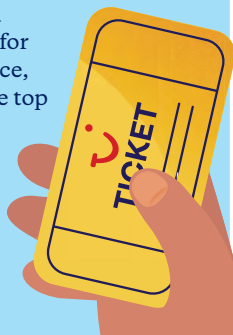

Meet the originals

TUI Isla, TUI Maya and TUI Skylia

This trio were the first ships in our river cruise fleet, and they sail along the likes of the Rhine and the Danube in Western and Central Europe. They're sister ships, so all three are identical when it comes to what's onboard. They're all Full Board Plus, too, so three meals and drinks at mealtimes are included in your package. Let's take a closer look at what they offer...

Dining

Each ship comes with two restaurants, which both offer flexible dining times and an open seating policy.

Verdastro is the main restaurant, and it's open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. The menu changes daily, with a spotlight on local flavours, so you can get a taste for the region you're in onboard as well as ashore. You can choose from a buffet or a menu at breakfast, while lunch and dinner are an à la carte affair with waiter service. Dishes include the likes of pork tenderloin, goulash and curry.



Things are a little more casual in Bistro, our second restaurant. It's joined at the hip with Verdaastro, giving you an extra dining option. And like its next door-neighbour, it's open for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

A swanky six-course gala dinner takes place once per sailing on cruises which are five nights or longer. You can get your glad rags on if you like, but there's no obligation to do so if you'd rather keep it casual.

There's also afternoon tea once per sailing on cruises which are five nights or longer. It's hosted in the Observatory, and you can tuck in to freshly made sandwiches and cakes.



Other facilities

Bars

There are two bars onboard. The Observatory takes pride of place at the heart of the ships. As with all our venues, you can expect widescreen windows for admiring the panoramic views. There's also a daily happy hour with complimentary canapés. After dark, the nightly entertainment's held here, which ranges from talented musicians to interactive quizzes.

Coffee and cocktails are the cornerstones of the Club Lounge. Plush chairs, brass fittings and mirrored tables set a sophisticated scene. By day, you can sip a premium Lavazza coffee* while taking in the views, then at night, you can clink pre-dinner cocktails* in front of a digital roaring fireplace

before heading to one of the restaurants. There's a small library and a selection of board games here as well, plus a digital games table.

Wellness area

The wellness area's equipped with a sauna and a whirlpool bath, for the perfect place to unwind after a day's sightseeing. It's free to use, but if you fancy having it to yourself, you can book a private session when you're onboard.

Top deck

The top deck's split into zones, with different areas for relaxation and activities. There are sunloungers, plus tables and chairs if you fancy some chill time. And if you want to switch up the pace, the activity area hosts deck games like minigolf, cornhole and shuffleboard.



Cabins

All our modern and stylish cabins are on the outside of the ship, with a porthole, a full-size window or a French Balcony. So, they make the perfect space to watch the world go by. You can choose from the likes of Single cabins, Standard cabins and French Balcony cabins, or opt for a French Balcony Suite cabin. As with all our cabins, you'll get a TV, a safe, Molton Brown toiletries, and tea and coffee-making facilities as standard. There are a few extras, too, like bathrobes and slippers, a nightly turndown service and a Continental breakfast in bed each morning.

*Lavazza coffee and cocktails aren't included as part of the Full Board Plus package. You'll need to either pay extra, or upgrade to the All Inclusive drinks package.

Discover the Douro

Meet TUI Luzia, who'll be the magic number seven in our fleet when she launches in June 2027. She'll be our first new-build river cruise ship, sailing the Douro River and its UNESCO-listed wine region, with plenty of scenic stops along the way.

Our seven-night Douro Discovery itinerary will start and end in Portugal's second-biggest city, Porto. In between, you'll stop off in cosy, scenic villages and towns like Entre-os-Rios, Barca d'Alva and Peso de Régua. You'll be able to pop across the border into Spain, too, and visit the preserved Old City of Salamanca - it's within easy daytripping distance from Vega de Terron. And if you're a wine lover, you're in luck - the banks of the river are teeming with vineyards and whitewashed barrel warehouses.

Port highlights...

Vega de Terron

Spain's just a stone's throw away from here. Hit Salamanca's Old City for Roman walls, a cathedral, and tapas-filled plazas.



Barca d'Alva

A sleepy riverside gem. Almond and olive trees mingle with vineyards, and the Douro's scenery does all the talking.

Porto

Tile-covered streets, riverside cafés, and the swooping Dom Luís I Bridge. Don't leave without trying a pastel de nata straight from a local bakery.



Peso de Régua

Vineyard heaven. Wander terraced hills or pop into a quintinha - or winery - for a cheeky glass of the region's famous Port.

TUI Bahareya

Since her launch in 2025, TUI Bahareya has become our second ship to sail the River Nile. Arabic-inspired interiors meet modern touches onboard, and expert Egyptologists bring the sights to life as you cruise.

And just so you know, it's All Inclusive as standard, so any drinks outside mealtimes are covered. Let's take a look at what else is in store...

Dining

Like all our river cruise ships, there are flexible dining times and an open seating policy.

Belhana is the ship's main restaurant for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Enjoy a mix of vibrant buffet spreads, live show-cooking and à la carte dinners with a local twist.



You'll find Sofra up on the top deck, open for light bites at lunch, as well as tea, coffee and cake every afternoon. In the evening, à la carte dinners showcase Egyptian-inspired dishes with river views. The decor here's like a modern-day Arab palace - think criss-cross arches, plush cushions, and warm white-and-brown tones.

Bars

The Observatory lounge is the ship's main bar and your hub for evening entertainment. Enjoy live music, quizzes, film nights, and local acts - from traditional Nubian performances to whirling dervish shows. By day, relax in the lounge and let the Egyptologists bring the river sights to life, all framed by floor-to-ceiling windows.

Up on the top deck is the Felucca bar - named after the traditional Nile sailboat. The Arabic-style decor continues here, and cocktails, wines, beers, and soft drinks are all on the menu, too.

Atrium

The Atrium is the main hub of the ship, where you'll find the reception desk and the shore experiences desk. There's a self-serve tea and coffee station here that's on hand 24/7, as well.

Hetep

Step into Hetep, the ship's wellness area. Relaxation rooms, a sauna and massage



rooms* are just the spot for a little 'me time' after a day of sightseeing.

Top deck

The top deck's split into different zones, with space for relaxation, dining and activities. There's a pool up here with plenty of sunloungers dotted around it, and you'll find the Felucca bar and Sofra restaurant.

Cabins

All the modern and stylish cabins come with a TV, a safe, and tea and coffee-making facilities as standard. You can choose between a number of cabins, including French Balcony Suite cabins and Balcony Suite cabins. There are a few little extras, too, such as bathrobes and slippers, complimentary mini bar on arrival, one 30-minute massage per person, and breakfast in bed a couple of times per week.





TUI Al Horeya

TUI Al Horeya was the fourth ship to join our fleet, and she's sailing along the world-famous River Nile in Egypt. The layout onboard is a little different to our European fleet, and this one's All Inclusive as standard, so all of your drinks outside of mealtimes are part of the package.

Let's take a closer look at what's onboard.



Dining

Like all our river cruise ships, there are flexible dining times and an open seating policy.

Lazeeza is the main restaurant. It's a bright and modern space, which serves up a mix of buffet and show-cooking options for breakfast and lunch, and à la carte meals for dinner.

You can dine al fresco, as well, at Felucca. This spot's on the top deck, and is open for light bites at lunch, as well as tea, coffee and cake every afternoon. In the evening, it's an à la carte restaurant with waiter service, where dishes with a local flavour are served. There's a buffet-style afternoon tea served here once per sailing, too.

Bars

The Observatory is the ship's main bar. It's a light and contemporary lounge which hosts nightly entertainment, where you can expect everything from local acts to live music, quizzes and films - plus weekly talks from Egyptologists. Felucca Bar, meanwhile, is on the top deck, and it's the perfect spot to sit back on comfy chairs and sofas while watching the world go by.

Atrium

The Atrium is the main hub of the ship, where you'll find the reception desk and the Cruise Director's desk. They're on hand to help with any questions, and you can book your shore experiences here, too.

Wellness area

This comes complete with fitness equipment and a space for exercise classes. And, if you want to take things a little easier, you can treat yourself to a massage for a little extra.

Top deck

The top deck's the idea spot for soaking up the scenery. Half of it is home to sunloungers, a pool and a couple of hot tubs, while the other half's where you'll find a restaurant, a bar and loads of comfy seating.

Cabins

All our modern and stylish cabins come with a TV, a safe, and tea and coffee-making facilities. You can choose from the likes of Single cabins and Superior French Balcony cabins, or opt for our Balcony Suite cabins. As well as the standard amenities, these come with a few extras, too, like bathrobes and slippers, a Continental breakfast twice per week, and a 30-minute massage.

Egyptian escapades

Africa's longest river just got twice as nice. Two itineraries mean double the chances to explore Egypt's iconic sights, from the temples of Edfu and Kom Ombo to the bustling streets of Luxor. Fly direct from London Gatwick or Manchester, and you'll be soaking up winter sun along the Nile in no time.

Our seven-night sailings - Legends of the Nile and Ancient Gods and Famous Pharaohs - start and finish in Luxor, with stops in Edfu, Kom Ombo and Aswan in between. Both ships alternate between itineraries, and you'll call into the same ports of call on both - just with some slight changes in schedules. Choose Legends of the Nile if you're keen on more time ashore to explore the ports, or Ancient Gods and Famous Pharaohs if you'd rather kick back and enjoy the sailing.

Plus, some of our more bespoke experiences include the likes of a tour of the Abu Simbel Temples, or a sound and light show at Karnak Temple. English-speaking guides will be with you on every shore experience, too.



Big-Hitting Sights Temple of Horus, Edfu

This place is one of Egypt's largest and most intact pharaonic temples. Step through the 36-metre-high gateway into a complex that's dedicated to Horus - a god with the body of a man and the head of a falcon.

Karnak Temple, Luxor

Karnak's famed for its collection of sanctuaries, kiosks, pylons and obelisks. It also hosts a 90-minute sound and light show, which gives you a glimpse into the lives of the pharaohs.



Hidden Gem: Aswan, Egypt

As the country's southernmost city, Aswan was once dubbed the gateway to ancient Egypt. These days, it's a destination in its own right - albeit a little under-the-radar. Check out its botanical gardens, or set eyes on unearthed artefacts in one of its museums.



Foodie Find: Koshari, Luxor

Koshari's eaten so often in Egypt, you'd think it counted as the sixth food group. This

national dish is made from rice, lentils, chickpeas and macaroni, all topped with tomato or garlic sauce. It's easy to track down in Luxor - most street food stalls and traditional restaurants serve it.

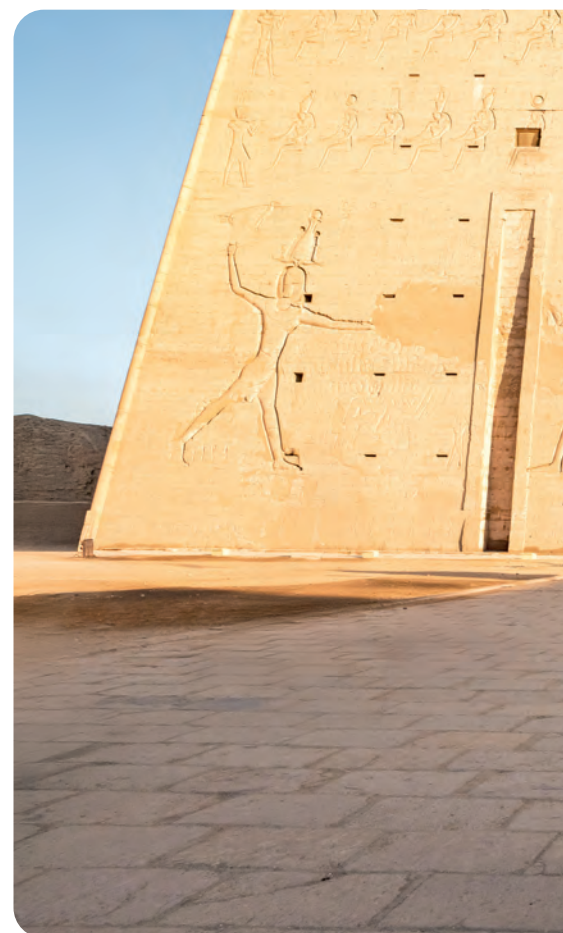


Perfect Picture: Sphinx Avenue, Luxor

When it comes to first-rate photo stops, Sphinx Avenue easily makes the cut. This three-kilometre-long walkway is lined with - you guessed it - sphinxes, with tall palms and the Luxor Temple as the backdrop.

Insider Info

One of the reliefs along Sphinx Avenue has a hieroglyph of Queen Cleopatra on it, which means she probably visited here on her Nile trip. Ask your guide to point it out to you, if you visit.

This adults-only hotel takes you on a culinary trip around the world with its global theme nights. A pair of pools, a private beach and a couple of seafront bars are on hand, too.



Iberotel Luxor Luxor

This hotel's standout feature is its swimming pool, which floats above the River Nile. It's even got a bar for company, which means your lazy days by the water are all sorted.



Steigenberger Achi Resort - Luxor

This place covers all the must-haves, from a pair of pools to a trio of restaurants, including an open-air Egyptian à la carte with views over the Nile.

Spotlight on Budapest

Hungary's capital is a city of two halves - both in name and geography. It's split down the middle by the Danube, with hilly Buda - and its imposing fortress - to the west, and lively Pest - with its famous ruin bars - to the east. Let's dig a little deeper on what to expect once your feet hit the cobbles...



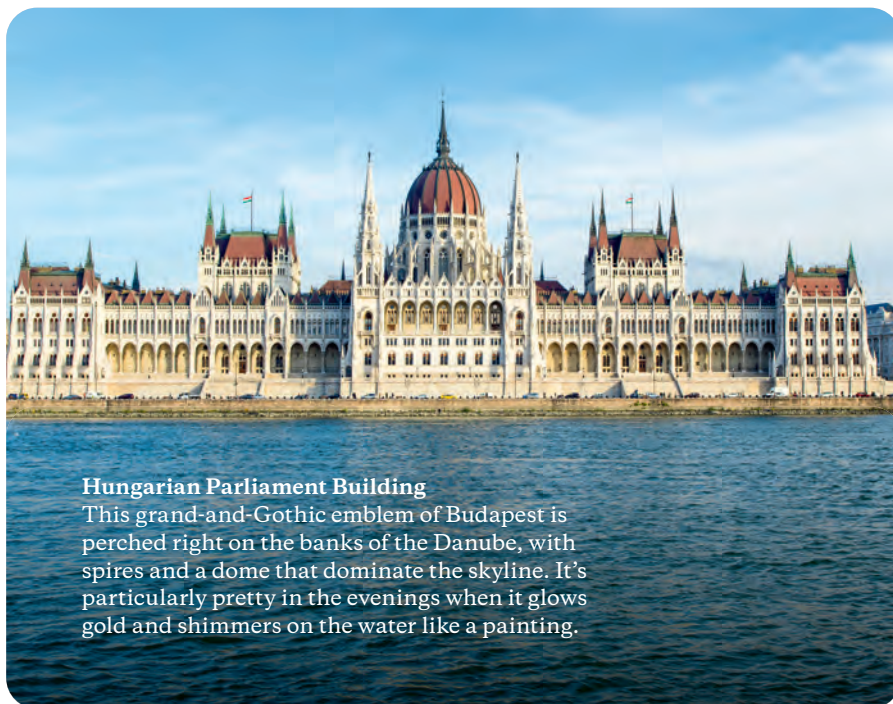
Foodie finds

Langos

This deep-fried flatbread is popular on street food stalls, and it's usually slathered in sour cream and cheese

Goulash

Hungary's national dish is a cross between stew and soup, with beef, carrots, onions and a hint of paprika all making the mix.



Hungarian Parliament Building

This grand-and-Gothic emblem of Budapest is perched right on the banks of the Danube, with spires and a dome that dominate the skyline. It's particularly pretty in the evenings when it glows gold and shimmers on the water like a painting.

Thermal baths

Often called the 'City of Spas', Budapest bubbles away with thermal springs dotted around the city, so you'll want to bring your swimwear as well as your walking shoes. **Széchenyi Baths** is the most famous, with outdoor pools steaming beneath butter-yellow colonnades and locals playing floating games of chess. **Gellért Baths** is another popular spot - known for its pretty mosaics and stained glass. For something a bit less touristy, try **Rudas Baths**. It comes complete with a rooftop hot pool overlooking the Danube.



Perfect picture

Hop on the funicular up to Castle Hill and Fisherman's Bastion and you'll tick off one of the best vantage points in the city. Alongside fairy tale towers, turrets, and terraces, you've also got unbeatable views of the Parliament building. It's ultra-photogenic, especially at sunset.

Cruise and Stay

Want to squeeze even more out of your Budapest trip? City tours, festive sailings, and adding a few extra days are all on the menu... here's the lowdown...



If you fancy seeing some of the sights up close, you can join one of the shore experiences in our River Cruises Collection:

Wrap things up at the 19th-century citadel where you'll snag sweeping views of Parliament, Budapest Castle and some of the ornate Danube bridges before heading back to the ship.

Deck the Danube

Budapest at Christmas has that little extra sparkle - and our festive Danube sailings are the perfect way to beat the winter blues.

The city's famous Christmas markets are a must-see, especially at St. Stephen's Basilica and Vörösmarty Square, with stocking-stuffer stalls and gifts you'll definitely want to make space for.

Warm up with chimney cakes, mulled wine, and other spiced treats, or escape the cold in one of the city's steamy thermal baths - they're like an open-air spa against the winter chill. Keep your eyes peeled for the Christmas trams, too, top to toe in lights, twinkling along the streets.
