A complete guide to your cabin

Meet the team

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Whether you've cruised before or you're completely new to it, here's everything you need to know to get up to speed with our ships.

Ship info

Onboard Ship Account

We operate a cashless system on board. Massage treatments are charged to your onboard account and you can pay for these at the end of your cruise by credit or debit card. You can also pay for them in cash if you prefer, either in Egyptian Pounds or US Dollars. Other extras onboard, such as items from the gift shop, are to be paid as you go, and can't be charged to your onboard account.

Going Ashore

When leaving the ship to go ashore, you'll be given a shore card as you leave, which you'll need to hand back when you get back onboard. This is so we know who is on and off the ship at all times. Before you leave, please take note of the 'all onboard' time, which can be found in reception, as well as in Navigate. Everyone must be back onboard by this time to ensure we can set sail on time.

Wellness Area

You can stay on top of your workout routine in the gym, which comes complete with fitness equipment and a space for exercise classes. And, if you want to take things a little easier, you can treat yourself to a massage, which you'll need to pre-book.

Departure Information

You'll need to vacate your cabins by midday. This is so our housekeeping team can prepare the cabins for our arriving guests.

Cabin info

Safety deposit boxes

Every cabin comes with a safety deposit box to store your valuables. They're free to use.

Telephone

You can use your cabin phone to call Reception - you'll see a preset button on the handset. If you want to call another cabin, just dial the cabin number.

Mobile phones

Depending on your mobile phone provider, your phone should work throughout your sailing. International roaming rates will apply, and prices are set by your operator.





Services

Reception

Reception's open 24/7, so you can visit them on Deck 2 or call them on your cabin phone by pressing the pre-set 'Reception' button.

Onboard Shop

You can buy a variety of merchandise from our gift shop onboard, including jewellery, gifts, books and souvenirs.

Housekeeping

Cabin stewards will visit twice a day to make sure everything's spick-and-span, and all cabins have a turndown service, as well. If you'd prefer housekeeping not to visit your cabin, then just pop the 'Do not disturb' sign on your door.

Laundry

To use our laundry service, simply request a bag from Reception. Place your items in the bag, then fill out the laundry slips - where you'll find prices for each

item. Once you're finished, just leave the bag on the bed for collection. Just so you know, we don't accept laundry the day before disembarkation, as we can't guarantee it'll be ready before you leave.

Navigate

Our Navigate app is your one-stop-shop for everything river cruise related - and it's completely free to use. All you need is a smartphone, a tablet, or a laptop.

• Once you've registered your device for Wi-Fi, you'll be directed to the Navigate home page. If this doesn't happen, you can type **navigate.tui** into your web browser.

Safety info



Moving Around The Ship

Unlike a hotel, a ship can move around unexpectedly, so take care when walking around the ship and its stairwells. Please use the handrails when you can and take extra care when walking through doors, as they might be heavier than you're used to with a raised lip to step over. You'll also need to take care when walking around the top deck, as it can become slippery when wet. Don't sit, climb or stand on the handrails. And avoid putting your hands or head over the side of the ship when coming in and out of the port, passing through locks and under bridges, or when opening vour cabin window.



Medical Equipment

If you have any special medical needs and require the use of a sharps box or medical bin, just let Reception or your Cruise Experience Manager know when you arrive and they'll make arrangements for you. For the safety of our crew, please don't dispose of any medical needles in the general waste bins.



Health & Sanitation

Please use the hand sanitisers positioned around the ship as often as possible. If you begin to feel unwell at any point, please return to your cabin and call reception.



Electrical Items

Please take care when using electrical items in your cabin. And don't leave appliances charging when you're not in your cabin, as it's a fire risk. Please don't use electric blankets and water heaters brought from home, since the ship's outlets are only 220 volts. Also, note that the sockets in the bathroom are for shavers only.

Safety drill

Here at TUI River Cruises, your safety is our number one priority. Therefore, every guest needs to complete the Emergency Passenger Safety Drill before we set sail

This is where we tell you the procedures to follow in the unlikely event of an emergency situation.

Here's a step-by-step guide for how to complete the safety drill and muster process.

- 1. When you first board the ship, load the Navigate app on your phone or tablet.
- 2. Click on the My Muster tile and watch the Muster Video.
- 3. Once you've watched the video, tick the two confirmation boxes that appear on the screen. If you don't have access to a smartphone or tablet, or you have any questions about the muster process, speak to your Cruise Experience Manager or reception who will be able to assist.



Muster Station

Your muster station is a safe location, where you need to gather in an emergency, and it's located on the top deck. Life jackets can be found in your cabin, and you can find directions for the quickest route to your muster station on the back of your cabin door.



Smoking Policy

Smoking and vaping is only allowed in designated smoking areas, which can be found on the top deck. Please don't move ashtrays into other areas - we want all our guests to have a space where they're comfortable, whether they smoke or not. Any guests found to be smoking in their cabin will be charged for a deep clean to freshen the cabin for future guests.



Tap Water

Please note, the tap water is not safe to drink, and it's advised to use bottled water when brushing your teeth, as well.

Emergency signal

In the event of an emergency, you'll probably hear several signals and alarms. If you hear this signal, you should stay calm and do the following...

- (i) If you're in your cabin, collect something warm to wear and any prescribed medication, then head straight to your muster station.
- i If you're not in your cabin, go straight to your muster station.
- i If there's smoke in the corridor, stay as low to the ground as

possible - the air is clearer here and the lighting will be easier to see.

You'll find further information on what to do during an emergency on the safety channel of your cabin's TV. If you've got any questions, please speak to Reception or your Cruise Experience Manager.

Navigate life onboard

It's easy to find our restaurant opening times, entertainment schedules and more - just use our free onboard app, Navigate. Here's how it works...

What is Navigate?

It's our free onboard app, which you can use to find out anything you need to know about your cruise - whether it's opening times, entertainment programmes, the weather forecast, or the following day's port. You can also use it to leave feedback.

What can I use it for?

- · See the day's Entertainment Schedule
- Find out the opening times of onboard bars and restaurants
- View details on the next day's port, schedule and weather forecast
- View maps and information about each port
- Leave feedback on your dining and entertainment experience



How can I access it?

Navigate is free to use. All you need is a smartphone, a tablet or a laptop. Once you're connected to the ship's Wi-Fi, Navigate will automatically open up.

For easy access, we recommend saving the app to your home screen, where possible.

Alternatively, you can go to your browser, and type in 'navigate.tui'.

Tastes and tipples



With a variety of options for dining and drinks, you can forget about rumbling stomachs and parched lips. Check out what you can look forward to onboard.

Felucca

This al fresco spot's up on the top deck. Light bites like burgers, kebabs and fruit are served at lunchtime and there's no need to book - just rock up when you're peckish. For dinner, you'll need to book a table in advance, and you can expect traditional fare on the menu - think shish kebabs, vegetable tagine and Egyptian style seabass. Just pop to reception to make a reservation.

Lozoozo

This is the main restaurant onboard, and its name means 'delicious' in Arabic. This bright, modern space is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner with waiter service. Breakfast and lunch is a mix of buffet and show-cooking options, whilst dinner is an à la carte affair.

Observatory

This light and contemporary lounge is the ship's main bar, and it plays host to the nightly entertainment onboard. The likes of live music and quizzes are on the cards, plus local acts like Egyptian Whirling Dervishes, Nubian shows and a weekly Galaya party, where you can really get involved by donning the traditional dress if you fancy. During the day meanwhile, there are weekly talks from Egyptologists, plus documentaries and films screened on TVs.







Felucca bar

This bar's right next to the restaurant which shares its name, and it's open all day. There's a variety of drinks to choose from, including the 'cocktail of the day', plus lots of comfy chairs and sofas to lounge on while you soak up the scenery.



Tea, coffee and cake

Tea, coffee and cake are served every afternoon in Felucca restaurant, on the top deck.

Afternoon tea

Afternoon tea is served once per cruise, where a variety of sweet and savoury bites are on the cards, including sandwiches, cakes and scones.



Gala Dinner

There's a six-course gala dinner hosted in Lazeeza, on every sailing. You can get your glad rags on, too, if you like, but there's no obligation to dress up.



Dietary Requirements

If you've got any dietary requirements, just let us know when you arrive and we'll set up a meeting with the maitre d'.



Dress code

During the day, the dress code's pretty relaxed, then come evening, things get a little smarter. Items like long trousers smart tailored shorts, shirts and polo shirts are fine, but it's best to leave the sportswear and vests in your cabin.



All Inclusive as standard

All your meals and drinks onboard come as part of the package.

Local Eats

From koshari to kofta - here are some must-eats you can tick off en route...

Mezze Egyptians like to warm up their taste buds with a plate of mezze at the start of a meal. It often includes taameya - the Egyptian take on falafel, made from fava beans instead of chickpeas - and a smoky aubergine dip called baba ganouche. And, it's usually finished off with a spoonful of creamy hummus.

Koshari This dish is a national favourite – it's a mix of rice, lentils, macaroni, chickpeas, fried onions and a spicy tomato sauce.

Om Ali This dessert
translates to 'Ali's Mother',
and while the origins of
the name are up for debate,
it definitely has a warm
and homely feel to it. The
dessert itself is a bread
pudding made of pastry
blended with nuts, raisins,
coconut, cinnamon, cream and
plenty of sugar. It's pretty
similar to bread pudding in
the UK, but it's a bit lighter
and milkier.

Kofta Forget the English post-clubbing snacks – Egyptian kofta kebabs are tasty stuff. Pop in to one of the traditional restaurants in the souks and order one of these thick, sausage-sized rolls of spicy minced lamb with a bowl of savoury rice and a bit of salad.

Shish taouk For this tasty kebab, chunks of succulent chicken are marinated in tomato and spices until the flavour has really absorbed, then grilled on a barbecue to turn them golden brown. They taste really rich and smoky, and are usually wrapped in pitta with salad and a dollop of garlic sauce.

Pick your pace onboard

Exploring ashore's not the only option with TUI River Cruises. There's an AM to PM programme of entertainment to keep you busy in between.



Night

In the evening, there's a whole host of nightly entertainment in the Observatory, including solo cabaret performances from our Entertainment team



Quizzes and silent discos

Our interactive gameshows and quizzes feature the latest technology, like buzzers and 'fastest finger first'. And don't forget our old favourite - the silent disco.



Jukebox bingo

Grab your bingo sheet and listen along to the songs. As soon as you hear one of yours being played, tick it off and fill your card out.

Get your muscles moving at a Yoga session, stretch class, or in the onboard gym.




Downtime

Cruise with a conscience

At TUI River Cruises, we believe the waterways we sail along are beautiful, and we want to keep them that way. Here are some ways we can all reduce our environmental impact and help local communities...

What we're doing

- O1 We've cut down on single-use plastic water bottles. You'll find reusable water bottles in your cabins, which you can keep.
- O2 We use recycled materials. For example, some of the carpets on our European fleet are made from recycled fishing nets.
- No more plastic straws. We've said goodbye to plastic straws in our drinks and replaced them with paper ones.
- O4 Local food. Lots of the produce used in our restaurants is sourced locally, which supports communities in our cruise destinations.
- We're all for charity. During the refurbishment of our European ships, we donated all the old furniture to a charity in the Netherlands.
- Less paper We've taken our
 Cruise News digital. You'll
 find it on our Navigate app,
 rather than in paper form.
 You can read a digital version
 of this magazine and our
 brochures, too.

- O7 Local guides. Our shore experiences are delivered by locally-employed guides, which supports the local economy.
- Sustainable experiences. We've added sustainable alternatives to our shore experience programme, such as the River Cruises Collection: Amsterdam Canal Cruise, which is operated by an electric boat.

What you can do

- O1) Buy locally made products. It's an easy way to support a local community. Plus, items that are flown or shipped in from overseas have a much larger carbon footprint.
- O2 Hang up your towels. By doing this, you're letting our crew know you don't need your towels to be washed every day.
- Try a few vegetarian meals.

 While you're onboard or out
 and about, try veggie-based
 dishes instead of meat meat
 produces higher levels of
 greenhouse gas emissions.
- O4 Recycle. You'll find recycling bins in all of the ship's public areas.



- O5 Eat like a local. Avoid eating at restaurant chains and instead, visit markets, local neighbourhoods or street vendors for your foodie needs.
 - Use apps and online confirmation for bookings.
 This means you can save on paper. And if you do use tourist maps or brochures, leave them behind for the next person to use, to save on more printing.

Danube

Europe's second-longest river flows through 10 countries. It also passes four grand capitals – Budapest, Vienna, Bratislava and Belgrade – which you can visit on our itineraries.

Heidelberg City Tour and Castle




Nile



River Cruises Collection shore experiences

Our River Cruises Collection shore experiences are all led by English-speaking guides, and you'll be picked up and dropped off back at the ship. Here are some of our favourites...



Luxor by hot air balloon

Get a birds-eye view of Luxor and find out why it's dubbed the 'world's greatest openair museum'. You'll start with a motorboat crossing to the Nile's West Bank, where you'll meet your pilot, crew, and fellow passengers. Once the hot air balloon's good to go, you'll hop in the basket and soar into the skies, where you'll be able to look down on sights like the Valley of the Kings, the Temple of Hatshepsut and the city centre.

Tombs of the Nobles & Kitcheners Island with a felucca experience

This trip starts with a ride on a felucca. These traditional wooden boats have been sailing on the Nile for centuries, and you'll float around Aswan's Nile islands on one before getting off at your first stop, the Tombs of the Nobles. These tombs mark the resting place for some of ancient Egypt's princes, governors, and other dignitaries. After, you'll hop back on the Felucca and head to Kitchener's Island. Aswan's botanical garden can be found here, and you'll have some time to wander among the exotic plants before heading back.

Tour of the High Dam, Unfinished Obelisk and Philae Temple in Aswan

You'll head to three of Aswan's top attractions on this trip. First up's the Aswan high dam. It was built in the 1960s to stop the Nile from flooding every year, and it also formed Lake Nasser - the world's largest artificial body of water. You'll also visit the Unfinished Obelisk, which lay undiscovered for thousands of years, before hopping on a traditional motorboat and heading to the island of Philae, where you'll have a tour of its temple.

Tour of Luxor museum & Mummification museum

You'll tick off two of Luxor's top museums on this three-hour trip, which starts with a visit to the Luxor museum on the banks of the Nile. The museum houses hundreds of artefacts which document the city's colourful history, including items from Tutankhamun's tomb. You'll then be taken over to the Mummification Museum just down the road, where you'll get a full insight into the mummification process, including its religious significance.

Sound and light show at Karnak Temple

This action-packed, 90-minute show looks back at the history of Thebes and the lives of the pharaohs. It starts at the avenue of Sphinxes, passes through the first pylon to the Great Court, and on through the great Hypostyle hall to the grandstand of the Sacred Lake for the big finale. Along the way, you'll hear stirring music and tales from the ancient pharaohs, while the ruins are illuminated by a dazzling light show.



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Meet the originals

TUI Isla, TUI Maya and TUI Skyla

This trio were the first ships in our river cruise fleet, and they sail along the likes of the Rhine and the Danube in Western and Central Europe. They're sister ships, so all three are identical when it comes to what's onboard. They're all Full Board Plus, too, so three meals and drinks at mealtimes are included in your package. Let's take a closer look at what they offer...

Dining

Each ship comes with two restaurants, which both offer flexible dining times and an open seating policy.

Verdastro is the main restaurant, and it's open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. The menu changes daily, with a spotlight on local flavours, so you can get a taste for the region you're in onboard as well as ashore. You can choose from a buffet or a menu at breakfast, while lunch and dinner are an à la carte affair with waiter service. Dishes include the likes of pork tenderloin, goulash and curry.



Things are a little more casual in Bistro, our second restaurant. It's joined at the hip with Verdastro, giving you an extra dining option. And like its next doorneighbour, it's open for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

A swanky six-course gala dinner takes place once per sailing on cruises which are five nights or longer. You can get your glad rags on if you like, but there's no obligation to do so if you'd rather keep it casual.

There's also afternoon tea once per sailing on cruises which are five nights or longer. It's hosted in the Observatory, and you can tuck in to freshly made sandwiches and cakes.





Other facilities

Bars

There are two bars onboard. The Observatory takes pride of place at the heart of the ships. As with all our venues, you can expect widescreen windows for admiring the panoramic views. There's also a daily happy hour with complimentary canapés. After dark, the nightly entertainment's held here, which ranges from talented musicians to interactive quizzes.

Coffee and cocktails are the cornerstones of the Club Lounge. Plush chairs, brass fittings and mirrored tables set a sophisticated scene. By day, you can sip a premium Lavazza coffee* while taking in the views, then at night, you can clink pre-dinner cocktails* in front of a digital roaring fireplace

before heading to one of the restaurants. There's a small library and a selection of board games here as well, plus a digital games table.

Wellness area

The wellness area's equipped with a sauna and a whirlpool bath, for the perfect place to unwind after a day's sightseeing. It's free to use, but if you fancy having it to yourself, you can book a private session when you're onboard.

Top deck

The top deck's split into zones, with different areas for relaxation and activities. There are sunloungers, plus tables and chairs if you fancy some chill time. And if you want to switch up the pace, the activity area hosts deck games like minigolf, cornhole and shuffleboard.



Cabins

All our modern and stylish cabins are on the outside of the ship, with a porthole, a full-size window or a French Balcony. So, they make the perfect space to watch the world go by. You can choose from the likes of Single cabins, Standard cabins and French Balcony cabins, or opt for a French Balcony Suite cabin. As with all our cabins, you'll get a TV, a safe, Molton Brown toiletries, and tea and coffeemaking facilities as standard. There are a few extras, too, like bathrobes and slippers, a nightly turndown service and a Continental breakfast in bed each morning.

*Lavazza coffee and cocktails aren't included as part of the Full Board Plus package. You'll need to either pay extra, or upgrade to the All Inclusive drinks package.

Discover the Douro

That's right, we're launching our seventh river cruise ship in the heart of Portugal's UNESCO-listed Douro Valley. From June 2027, our first new-build ship, TUI Luzia, will set sail along the Douro River, through the world's oldest recognised wine region, with plenty of scenic stops along the way.





Our seven-night Douro Discovery itinerary will start and end in Portugal's second-biggest city, Porto. In between, you'll stop off in cosy, scenic villages and towns, like Entre-os-Rios, Barca d'Alva and Peso de Régua. You'll be able to pop across the border into Spain, too, and visit the preserved Old City of Salamanca - it's within easy daytripping distance from Vega de Terron. And if you're a wine lover, you're in luck - the banks of the river are teeming with vineyards and whitewashed barrel warehouses.

3 dining venues

The main restaurant, Sorriso, will be open for all three meals with a mix of buffet and à la carte options, while dinner will also be available at Vinha. This place will put the focus on local dishes and there'll be full waiter service here. Cinder, meanwhile, will be the bar and dining area on the top deck.

3 bars

There'll be three bars dotted around the ship, including Novo Lounge. This light and modern space will play host to the nightly entertainment, including familiar favourites like live music and interactive quizzes.

TUI Bahareya

TUI Bahareya is our second ship sailing along the River Nile, with her maiden voyage taking place in November 2025. Arabic-inspired style meets modern touches onboard, while Egyptologists bring the sights to life as you pass. Let's take a closer look at what you can look forward to...



Like all our river cruise ships, there are flexible dining times and an open seating policy.



Belhana is the ship's main restaurant for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Enjoy a mix of vibrant buffet spreads, live showcooking and á la carte dinners with a local twist.









Atrium

The Atrium is the main hub of the ship, where you'll find the reception desk and the shore experiences desk. There's a selfserve tea and coffee station here that's on hand 24/7, as well.

Step into Hetep, the ship's wellness area. The sauna and massage rooms* make the perfect pit stop for a little 'me-time' after a day's sightseeing.

The top deck's split into different zones, with space for relaxation, dining and activities. There's a pool up here with plenty of sunloungers dotted around it, and you'll find the Felucca bar and Sofra restaurant.

All the modern and stylish cabins come with a TV, a safe, and tea and coffee-making facilities as standard. You can choose between a number of cabins, including French Balcony Suite cabins and Balcony Suite cabins. As well as the standard facilities, these come with a few extras, too, like bathrobes and slippers, breakfast in bed twice per week, and upgraded toiletries.



TUI Aria

It's all eyes on the pool for our second act, TUI Aria – sailing the Rhine, the Moselle, and the Dutch and Belgian waterways from summer 2026. The pool pulls off a fleetfirst with a retractable roof, letting you swim all-year-round, so be sure to pack your swimwear. Let's see what else you can expect onboard...



Dining

It'll be a Full Board Plus setup onboard, so three meals and drinks at mealtimes will be included in your package.



On cruises of five nights or longer, you'll enjoy a six-course gala dinner - dress up if you fancy, or keep it casual - plus a classic afternoon tea of freshly-made sandwiches and cakes.



The lounge bar - Observatory - is your go-to for evenings onboard. Get comfy, grab a drink, and enjoy live music, local acts, quizzes and film nights. And with its floor-to-ceiling windows, the river's always part of the show.

Reflections

TUI Aria's pool has a party trick up her sleeve - with a retractable roof, it doubles as an indoor or outdoor spot, so you can swim whatever the weather. Panoramic windows let you soak up the scenery as you float, and afterwards, the sauna is perfect for a post-swim unwind. By evening, the space transforms into a dining area with an Italian-inspired menu, plus occasional live music and film nights.

Top deck

The top deck's a spacious zone for relaxing and activities. Stretch out on a lounger for some sunbathing, join a yoga session, or try shuffleboard. There's even a small putting green if you fancy a few holes between ports. And keep your cameras handy - castles, vineyards, and storybook towns line the Rhine, Moselle, and the Dutch and Belgian waterways.

Cabins

All the cabins on TUI Aria are bright, modern, and come with air-conditioning, a hairdryer, a flatscreen TV, a safe, and tea and coffee-making facilities. Choose from the likes of Superior French Balcony or Superior Cabins for sliding doors and big-picture windows, Standard cabins with cosy portholes, or Single cabins for solo travellers.








Spotlight on Budapest

Hungary's capital is a city of two halves - both in name and geography. It's split down the middle by the Danube, with hilly Buda - and its imposing fortress - to the west, and lively Pest - with its famous ruin bars - to the east. Let's dig a little deeper on what to expect once your feet hit the cobbles...

Big-hitting sights



Perfect picture

Hop on the funicular up to Castle Hill and Fisherman's Bastion and you'll tick off one of the best vantage points in the city. Alongside fairy tale towers, turrets, and terraces, you've also got unbeatable views of the Parliament building. It's ultraphotogenic, especially at sunset.



Foodie finds

Langos

This deep-fried flatbread is popular on street food stalls, and it's usually slathered in sour cream and cheese

Goulash

Hungary's national dish is a cross between stew and soup, with beef, carrots, onions and a hint of paprika all making the mix.

Thermal baths

Often called the 'City of Spas', Budapest bubbles away with thermal springs dotted around the city, so you'll want to bring your swimwear as well as your walking shoes. Széchenyi Baths is the most famous, with outdoor pools steaming beneath buttervellow colonnades and locals playing floating games of chess. Gellért Baths is another popular spot - known for its pretty mosaics and stained glass. For something a bit less touristy, try Rudas Baths. It comes complete with a rooftop hot pool overlooking the Danube.




Say hello to summer 2026


