

Whether you've cruised before or you're completely new to it, here's everything you need to know to get up to speed with our ships.


Ship info

Onboard Ship Account

We operate a cashless system on board. Everything you purchase will be charged to your onboard account. You can register your credit card during the first five days of your sailing. At the end of your cruise, a statement will be delivered to your cabin, and we'll charge the outstanding amount to your registered credit card. If you want to settle your account in cash or debit card, you can do so by visiting reception - please note that any cash payments must be made in Euros.

Going Ashore

When leaving the ship to go ashore, you'll need to collect your shore card from reception and hand it back in when you return. This is so we know who is on and off the ship at all times. Before you leave, please take note of the all onboard time, which can be found on the digital screens in reception and the coffee area, as well as in Navigate. Everyone must be back onboard by this time to ensure we can set sail on time.

Wellness Area

You can soothe any aching muscles in the Wellness Area. With a sauna and a whirlpool bath, it's the perfect place to unwind after a day's sightseeing. The Wellness Area is open for everyone to use, however if you'd like to book the area for private use, we have several slots available during your sailing that can be booked directly with reception for a small fee.

Toilet System

The flushing system used onboard is a vacuum type and is extremely sensitive. Do not discard any bulky objects into the toilet, including facial wipes, sanitary items, moist toilet wipes or excessive amounts of toilet paper. Disposal of items other than small amounts of toilet paper will damage and block the toilet system.

Departure Information

You'll need to vacate your cabins by 9am. This is so our housekeeping team can prepare the cabins for our arriving guests. If you've booked the Little Extras package, you can stay in your cabin until 11am.

Safety deposit boxes

Every cabin comes with a safety deposit box to store your valuables. They're free to use.

TV

When the ship arrives in port, it'll switch to the local power supply. When doing so, your TV might turn off for a few minutes. Don't worry, it's not broken, so you don't need to report this.

Telephone

You can use your cabin phone to call Reception - you'll see a preset button on the handset. If you want to call another cabin, just dial the cabin number.

Mobile phones

Depending on your mobile phone provider, your phone should work throughout your sailing. International roaming rates might apply, and prices are set by your operator.




Wi-Fi

There's free Wi-Fi access throughout the ship – speeds and coverage may vary.

To log on:

You'll be taken to a sign in page, which requires a password. You can find it in reception, or just ask the reception team.



Services

Reception

Reception's open 24/7, so you can visit them on Deck 2 or call them on your cabin phone by pressing the pre-set 'Reception' button.

Onboard Shop

You can buy branded TUI River Cruises merchandise onboard, including tote bags, travel mugs, magnets, baseball caps, pens and TUI ship postcards.

Housekeeping

Cabin stewards will visit once a day to make sure everything's spick-and-span. If you'd prefer not to have housekeeping visit your cabin, then just pop the 'Do not disturb' sign on your door. And just so you know, if you're staying in a suite, you'll have a turn down service.

Laundry

To use our laundry service, simply request a bag from Reception. Place your items in the bag, then fill out the laundry slips - where you'll find prices for

each item. Once you're finished, contact Reception, who will arrange for your bag to be collected. Just so you know, we don't accept laundry the day before disembarkation, as we can't guarantee it'll be ready before you leave.

Navigate

Our Navigate app is your one-stop-shop for everything river cruise related - and it's completely free to use. All you need is a smartphone, a tablet, or a laptop.

- Once you've registered your device for Wi-Fi, you'll be directed to the Navigate home page. If this doesn't happen, you can type navigate.tui into your web browser.
- To access your onboard bill, you'll need to scan your passport at reception, and you'll then be prompted to use your name and date of birth on Navigate.

Safety info



Moving Around The Ship Unlike a hotel, a ship can move around unexpectedly, so take care when walking around the ship and its stairwells. Please use the handrails when you can and take extra care when walking through doors, as they might be heavier than you're used to with a raised lip to step over. You'll also need to take care when walking around the top deck, as it can become slippery when wet. Don't sit, climb or stand on the handrails. And avoid putting your hands or head over the side of the ship when coming in and out of the port, passing through locks and under bridges, or when opening your cabin window.



Medical Equipment

If you have any special medical needs and require the use of a sharps box or medical bin, just let Reception or your Cruise Experience Manager know when you arrive and they'll make arrangements for you. For the safety of our crew, please don't dispose of any medical needles in the general waste bins.



Electrical Items

Please take care when using electrical items in your cabin. And don't leave appliances charging when you're not in your cabin, as it's a fire risk. Please don't use electric blankets and water heaters brought from home, since the ship's outlets are only 220 volts. Also, note that the sockets in the bathroom are for shavers only.



Health & Sanitation

Please use the hand sanitisers positioned around the ship as often as possible. If you begin to feel unwell at any point, please return to your cabin and call reception.



Tap Water

The tap water's safe to drink, and due to international standards, is chlorinated. You can get your water bottle topped up at the bar while you're onboard, too.



Muster Station

Your muster station is a safe location, where you need to gather in an emergency. It's located on the top deck and is where you'll find life jackets. You can find directions for the quickest route to your muster station on the back of your cabin door.



Smoking Policy

Smoking and vaping is only allowed in designated smoking areas, which can be found on the top deck. Please don't move ashtrays into other areas – we want all our guests to have a space where they're comfortable, whether they smoke or not. Any guests found to be smoking in their cabin will be charged for a deep clean to freshen the cabin for future guests.



In the event of an emergency, you'll probably hear several signals and alarms. **The general emergency signal** will be demonstrated during the safety drill at your welcome meeting.

If you hear this signal, you should stay calm and do the following...



If you're in your cabin, collect something warm to wear and any prescribed medication, then head straight to your muster station.



If you're not in your cabin, go straight to your muster station.



If there's smoke in the corridor, stay as low to the ground as possible - the air is clearer here and the lighting will be easier to see.

You'll find further information on what to do during an emergency on the safety channel of your cabin's TV. If you've got any questions, please speak to Reception or your Cruise Experience Manager.

Navigate life onboard

It's easy to find our restaurant opening times, entertainment schedules, or your most up-to-date bill - just use our free onboard app, Navigate.

Here's how it works...

What is Navigate?

It's our free onboard app, which you can use to find out anything you need to know about your cruise - whether it's opening times, entertainment programmes, the weather forecast, or the following day's port. You can also use it to view your onboard account, or leave feedback.

What can I use it for?

- Check your most up-to-date bill on your onboard account
- See the day's Entertainment Schedule
- Find out the opening times of onboard bars and restaurants
- View details on the next day's port, schedule and weather forecast
- View maps and information about each port
- Leave feedback on your dining and entertainment experience
- View the daily menus for the restaurants



How can I access it?

Navigate is free to use. All you need is a smartphone, a tablet or a laptop. Once you're connected to the ship's Wi-Fi, Navigate will automatically open up.

For easy access, we recommend saving the app to your home screen, where possible.

Alternatively, you can go to your browser, and type in 'navigate.tui'.

Treat yourself to a bottle of wine or Prosecco served on ice, in your cabin.





A taste of Europe

You don't need to go ashore for some European flavour, our onboard restaurants and bars serve seasonal dishes and regional wines, too. Take a look at where you can drink and dine onboard.

Observatory

At the heart of the ship, you'll find Observatory, where the evening entertainment takes place. You can admire the views through the widescreen windows, or out on the al fresco terrace. There's a daily happy hour with complimentary canapés, too.





Verdastro

The menu changes daily at our main waiter service restaurant, which is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. It's made up of fresh, seasonal produce, sourced from local suppliers. You can pick from the likes of sea bream, tortellini and lamb shank.



Bistro

This eatery's a more casual affair, with buffet-style breakfast and lunch, and an á la carte dinner menu. The menu includes dishes with a local flare that showcase some of the produce from the region you're in.



Club Lounge

This lounge is the place to come for a fix of premium Lavazza coffee* during the day. And, after dark, it transforms into an elegant cocktail bar.





Upgrade to All Inclusive

All our ships are Full Board Plus as standard, which means you get tea, coffee, soft drinks, wine or beer with meals. There's the option of house white, red or rosé wine at lunch and dinner, or you can try the specially selected wine from the region at dinnertime.

Any other drinks need to be paid for, or you can upgrade to All Inclusive. This way, you'll get a wider selection of drinks included, like draught beers, branded spirits, cocktails and premium Lavazza coffee. For select cabins, your minibar** will be part of the package, too. You can upgrade at Reception during your first day onboard.

Upgrades apply to all guests in each cabin.



Afternoon tea

Afternoon tea is served once per cruise on sailings of five nights or more, where a variety of sweet and savoury items are on the cards.



Dietary Requirements

If you've got any dietary requirements, just let us know when you arrive and we'll set up a meeting with the maitre d'.



Dress Code

During the day, the dress code's pretty relaxed - you just can't wear beachwear in the restaurants. Come evening, things get a little smarter. Items like long trousers, smart tailored shorts, shirts and polo shirts are fine, but it's best to leave the sportswear and vests in your cabin.



Gala Dinner

There's a six-course gala dinner - plus petit fours - on our sailings which are five nights or longer. You can get your glad rags on, too, if you like, but there's no obligation to dress up.

Currywurst, Germany

It's all about the wurst,
AKA sausage, in Germany.
This fast food staple
involves fried sausage cut
into slices and covered in
curried ketchup. It's best
served with fries.

Bitterballen, Netherlands

These Dutch meatballs are a staple snack in bars and pubs around the Netherlands. They're breaded and fried for a crispy shell and a soft, gooey centre.

Wiener schnitzel, Austria

Meaning 'Viennese cutlet',
it's the meat that makes the
difference from a regular
schnitzel. Veal is the
Viennese tradition, but the
breaded and fried coating
remains the same.

Cruise with a conscience

At TUI River Cruises, we believe Europe's waterways are beautiful and we want to keep them that way. Here are some ways we can all reduce our environmental impact and help local communities...

What we're doing

- We've cut down on single-use plastic water bottles. Instead, you'll find reusable bottles in your cabins, which you can keep.
- We use recycled materials.

 Some of our carpets around the ship are made from recycled fishing nets.
- O3 No more plastic straws. We've said goodbye to plastic straws in our drinks and replaced them with paper ones.
- O4 Local food. Lots of the produce used in our restaurants is sourced locally, which supports communities in our cruise destinations.
- 05 We're all for charity. During the refurbishment of our ships, we donated all the old furniture to a charity in the Netherlands.
- O6 Less paper. We've taken our Cruise News digital. You'll find it on our Navigate app, rather than in paper form.

- O7 Local guides. Our shore experiences are delivered by locally-employed guides, which supports the local economy.
- O8 Sustainable experiences. We've added sustainable alternatives to our shore experience programme, such as the River Cruises Collection: Amsterdam Canal Cruise, which is operated by an electric boat.

What you can do

- O1) Buy locally made products. It's an easy way to support a local community. Plus, items that are flown or shipped in from overseas have a much larger carbon footprint.
- O2) Hang up your towels. By doing this, you're letting our crew know you don't need your towels to be washed every day.
- Try a few vegetarian meals.
 While you're onboard or out
 and about, try veggie-based
 dishes instead of meat meat
 produces higher levels of
 greenhouse gas emissions.
- Use apps and online confirmation for bookings.

 This means you can save on paper. And if you do use tourist maps or brochures, leave them behind for the next person to use, to save on more printing.
- 65 Eat like a local. Avoid eating at restaurant chains and instead, visit markets, local neighbourhoods or street vendors for your foodie needs.
- Recycle. You'll find recycling bins in all of the ship's public areas.








Danube

Navigating the Nile



November 2024 saw the launch of our latest ship, TUI Al Horeya, along the River Nile. Simon Austin and Donna Barter from our Product Development team tell us a bit more about their role with TUI River Cruises, including how they planned our first ever cruise on Africa's longest river. Plus, they give us a taste of what's to come on our second Nile ship, TUI Bahareya.

- ② Can you tell us a bit about your role? What do you do day-to-day?
- A Simon: As the Customer Experience and Product Development Manager, I evolve our new products from start to finish. I support designs, set service standards and work with the team to make our product stand out in the UK market. Day to day, I'll collaborate with shipyards and ship designers to brief, oversee and approve designs. I also focus on the onboard experience for our customers, ensuring the fleet keeps evolving, getting better and better.
- A Donna: I'm involved in product development for TUI River Cruises, working closely with the marketing side of the Customer Experience team and looking at gaps in the market to spot what our customers are looking for, and designing products around this. I'm always looking at new and exciting destinations to take our customers to, plus I'm responsible for the entertainment proposition onboard and the extras you can add on to your cruise.

- O How did you choose the River Nile as our new destination?
- A Simon: A Nile river cruise is an amazing way to dive into Egypt's rich history and impressive scenery. You get to visit iconic landmarks like the temples of Luxor, Karnak, and Aswan, all without constant packing and unpacking. Plus, you'll enjoy incredible views of the Nile and rural Egypt, and experience local life along the riverbanks. It's a journey you won't forget!
- A Donna: Because I'm one of the newest members of the team, the Nile proposition had already been scoped out when I joined, however, having spoken with fellow colleagues and having been in TUI for almost 15 years, I know that the Nile was always a popular destination when we operated smaller ships on there some years ago. It's something our customers have been asking for, for some time, and there's absolutely a gap in the market.
- How did you develop TUI Al Horeya?
 What went into planning, decorating, choosing what to include etc.?
- A Simon: The success of any ship launch hinges on strong relationships. This involves collaboration between the shipyard and interior designers, including things like approving furniture or artwork and visiting the ship at every stage. Weekly meetings are held to discuss practicality and concepts, and I work with Egyptologists and locals to create an amazing experience that gives guests a true taste of Egyptian culture.
- A Donna: We looked at customer feedback and homed in on what their key priorities are from a holiday, then started an ideas board around this. As my first time designing a ship, it's been great fun bringing out my creative side and working with lots of different colleagues both internally and externally to bring things to life. We wanted to expand on our successful European fleet and ensure we brought in a stylish yet authentic feel to this ship. People travelling on the Nile want to be immersed in culture and enjoy some winter sun, so these are the themes we've worked with.
- **Q** What's your favourite thing about sailing the River Nile?
- A Simon: Sailing on the River Nile is such an adventure! Imagine visiting ancient temples and monuments like the Karnak Temple and the Valley of

- the Kings, and really getting a taste of Egyptian culture with local cuisine, music, and dance. The scenic views along the Nile, with lush greenery and beautiful sunsets, are breathtaking. Plus, there's the relaxation factor just unwinding on the deck with the gentle river breeze. And let's not forget the unique experiences, like learning from Egyptologists and locals about the rich history and culture of Egypt.

If you fancy scratching beneath the surface of our destinations, you can choose between our guided River Cruises Collection shore experiences, or explore independently with our tickets and attractions. Let's dive in and take a closer look...

River Cruises Collection shore experiences

Our River Cruises Collection shore experiences are all led by English-speaking guides, and you'll be picked up and dropped off back at the ship. Here are some of our favourites...



Amsterdam Canal Cruise Amsterdam's home to over 100 kilometres of UNESCO-protected canals, 1,500 bridges and 90 islands, most of which you'll find clustered around its culture-packed centre. And with more than 900 years of history under its belt, there's no shortage of standout sights. On this laidback canal cruise, onboard a fully electric boat, you'll get to see plenty of them, including the likes of Rembrandt Square and the City Hall. Plus, you'll get a good look at the city's smorgasbord of architectural styles, which include everything from 17th-century red-brick merchant mansions to modern glassfronted towers.

Paprika tasting and a horse show Paprika and horses might seem an unusual pairing, but that's exactly what you'll get on this experience. You'll start with a tour and an introduction to paprika processing, plus a chance to sample some local products. Then you'll be greeted by some Hungarian folk music and traditional local snacks, before sitting down for a 45-minute horse show led by the Koch Ten - a lone horseman who leads 10 horses by hand. After, there's a carriage ride across the Hungarian Puszta - an enormous area of open grassland which covers most of the country - before a chance to sample some more local delicacies.

O3 Strasbourg City Tour

This half-day tour will transfer you from your ship at Kehl, in Germany, to Strasbourg, in France, just over the border. Strasbourg's known for being the formal seat of the European Parliament, and its architecture is a blend of French and German, thanks to its location. This excursion includes an hour-long bus tour through the city, plus a guided walk through what's known as Petite France. This charming area's full of cobblestone streets, canals and well-preserved, halftimbered homes. From here, you'll head to the thousand-year-old Notre Dame Cathedral, where you'll have some free time to explore.

Mauthausen concentration camp and memorial tour

There's a sobering feel to this half-day excursion, which starts with a 45-minute transfer to the Mauthausen concentration camp and memorial. On arrival, you'll be taken on a 90-minute guided tour of the camp by specially trained guides. The route's been specifically chosen to follow the same one that prisoners would've been subjected to, which gives the tour a distinctive slant. After the tour, there are around 30 minutes of free time before the return transfer to Linz.

Leopold Museum Vienna - skip-the-line tickets

Avoid the queues and head straight into the Leopold Museum in Austria's grand capital where more than 5,000 works of art are on show. This place is one of the most important collections of modern Austrian art in the world and displays masterpieces from the Wiener Secession to Art Nouveau and Expressionism.



Introducing, TUI Ria

Exciting news - we're launching our sixth ship in summer 2026, when **TUI Ria** joins the fleet along the Rhine, the Moselle and the Dutch and Belgian waterways. Here's a little taste of what to expect...



Cabins

All of the cabins will have a bright, modern feel and will include air-conditioning, a hairdryer, a flatscreen TV, a safe, and tea and coffee making facilities.

And here's a sneak peek at a couple of the brandnew itineraries you can look forward to...

- O1 North Rhine & Netherlands Explorer
 You'll spend the first half of this sevennight itinerary in the Netherlands.
 It starts in the capital, Amsterdam,
 then ticks off the second-largest city,
 Rotterdam, and the country's oldest
 city, Nijmegen. On day five, you'll
 cross the border into Germany, and
 visit Dusseldorf, Koblenz, Boppard
 and Rudesheim, before finishing up in
 Frankfurt.
- O2 North Rhine & Moselle Explorer
 On this nine-night itinerary, you'll spend
 the first week of your river cruise in
 Germany before a final few days in the
 Netherlands. First up is the skyscraperfilled city of Frankfurt, before stops in
 Rudesheim, Cochem, Trier, BernkastelKues, Koblenz and Cologne. You'll then
 cross the border on day eight and visit
 Rotterdam, before rounding the itinerary
 off in Amsterdam.





The Netherlands' second-biggest city usually sits in the shadows of the country's capital, Amsterdam, when it comes to tourism. However, 'the Gateway to the World', as it's often called has a fair few highlights of its own to shout about. Let's dig a little deeper on what to expect when you dock here...

Big-hitting sights

The Erasmus Bridge – or Erasmusbrug to give it its Dutch name – is Rotterdam's most iconic landmark and connects the north and south of the city. In fact, it's so iconic, it even makes up part of the city's official logo. If you fancy a stroll across, it's 802 metres end-to-end.

St. Lawrence Church

This Gothic church has been standing tall in the city's old quarter for more than 600 years...just. During World War Two, Rotterdam was flattened by bombing, and this was one of a small handful of buildings to survive. While the rest of the city centre had a full modernisation, the church was painstakingly restored to former glories, and nowadays, it's the only reminder left from the city's Medieval past.

Maritime Museum Rotterdam

Rotterdam's maritime museum is probably the best place to learn about the city's proud nautical history. It's been around since 1874 and houses more than 850,000 objects from six centuries of seafaring voyages. Next to it, meanwhile, is the open-air Maritime Museum Harbour, where you can see a collection of historic working vessels.



Foodie find Bitterballen

These Dutch meatballs are a staple snack in bars and pubs around the city. They're breaded and fried for a crispy shell and a soft, gooey centre.



Perfect picture Euromast Tower

For the best bird's-eye views head to the iconic Euromast Tower. There's a 360° viewing platform 112 metres above the ground, but if you're feeling really daring, head up to the next viewing platform and peak through the glass floor—that one's 185 metres off the ground.

Egyptian escapades

We ventured into new waters in winter 2024. when the freshest member of our fleet, TUI Al Horeya, set sail along the famous River Nile. And this winter, she'll be joined on Africa's longest river by a second ship, TUI Bahareya. Plus, with direct TUI flights from London Gatwick and Manchester to the ships' home port, Luxor, you'll be soaking up some winter sun before you know it.

Our seven-night sailing, Legends of the Nile, starts and finishes in Luxor, with stops in Edfu, Kom Ombo and Aswan in-between. There are loads of shore experiences you can book along the way, including trips to the Valley of the Kings, Hatshepsut Temple, Karnak and Luxor Temples, and Aswan High Dam. You also have trips to Edfu Temple and Kom Ombo Temple included as part of your package.

Plus, some of our more bespoke experiences include the likes of a tour of the Abu Simbel Temples, or a sound and light show at Karnak Temple, and English-speaking guides will be with you on every excursion. And don't forget, this winter we'll have two ships sailing along the Nile, when TUI Bahareya joins the fleet. There'll be a second itinerary, too - Ancient Gods and Famous Pharaohs - and both ships will alternate between itineraries.



Big-Hitting Sights

Temple of Horus, Edfu
This place is one of Egypt's largest and most intact pharaonic temples. Step through the 36-metre-high gateway into a complex that's dedicated to Horus - a god with the body of a man and the head of a falcon.

Karnak Temple, Luxor Karnak's famed for its collection of sanctuaries, kiosks, pylons and obelisks. It also hosts a 90-minute sound and light show, which gives you a glimpse into the lives of the pharaohs.



Hidden Gem: Aswan, Egypt

As the country's southernmost city, Aswan was once dubbed the gateway to ancient Egypt. These days, it's a destination in its own right - albeit a little underthe-radar. Check out its botanical gardens, or set eyes on unearthed artefacts in one of its museums.



Foodie Find: Koshari, Luxor

Koshari's eaten so often in Egypt, you'd think it counted as the sixth food group. This national dish is made from rice, lentils, chickpeas and macaroni, all topped with tomato or garlic sauce. It's easy to track down in Luxor – most street food stalls and traditional restaurants serve it.





Perfect Picture: Sphinx Avenue, Luxor

When it comes to firstrate photo stops, Sphinx Avenue easily makes the cut. This three-kilometre-long walkway is lined with - you guessed it - sphinxes, with tall palms and the Luxor Temple as the backdrop.

Insider Info

One of the reliefs along Sphinx Avenue has a hieroglyph of Queen Cleopatra on it, which means she probably visited here on her Nile trip. Ask your guide to point it out to you, if you visit.






Say hello to summer 2026


Danube Treasures
