

## STARTA NEW FAMILY TRADITION

We've caught up with experts from ski schools across
Europe, to get their top tips on teaching kids to ski.

If it's your very first time on the slopes, flip over this
brochure to read everything about skiing
for beginners.



## What's the best age for kids to learn?

Children can start ski school from as early as 3 years old. At this age, it's more about playing in the snow and gently sliding on skis for the first time. Older children will still play games, but there's more focus on skiing technique. As for snowboarding, children can try it out from around the age of 8.

## How long does it usually take to pick up the basics?

Just like in school at home, it really depends. At first, the most important thing is to get children familiar with the equipment and to teach them how to stop safely. Then we tend to build things up step-by-step – depending on how confident they are and how quickly they pick up the basics, some kids will be independent on green and blue slopes by the end of the week. Remember that children learn more slowly in the very beginning, then they tend to overtake us adults very quickly.

## Should children always have lessons?

Any habits you form when you first start skiing or snowboarding tend to stick for life, so learning through ski school means that kids start off on the right foot. Plus, lessons are more than pure tuition – they'll get to have fun, play games and make new friends.

## Do they need to have lessons at an indoor snow centre before going on a ski holiday?

It's not necessary, but it can be a good idea so your children can have a go and get used to everything. Plus, if they really don't like it, at least you'll know before booking a holiday.





## Arrive at ski school early to watch other kids skiing and having fun

## Do you have any top tips for parents?

Arrive at ski school a bit early so it's not a stressful start to the day and you can watch the other kids skiing and having fun. And it's fine if you want to stick around for the first few minutes of your child's lesson, but it's best to observe from a distance so they don't get distracted.

One last top tip: It's always helpful if kids are already familiar with their ski clothes, goggles and helmet - why not go for a short walk on your first day in resort to get used to everything?

## What makes a good family ski resort?

Walking to the ski slopes or lifts can be tiring for both adults and children, so we usually recommend resorts with plenty of accommodation that's ski-in, ski-out, or just a very short walk away. And of course, think about your family's level of skiing. Beginner families will want lots of wide, easy runs to practise on together.

## • When's the best time for a family trip?

If your children are not in school yet, January is normally good for reliable snow conditions and the resorts are not too busy. Otherwise, skiing over Christmas is magical for children of all ages. Or going over spring half term and Easter means you'll likely have sunnier skies and warmer temperatures, so no complaints of cold fingers.


## What clothing should kids wear on the slopes?

Pretty much the same as for adults. So a ski jacket and salopettes/ski trousers, as well as a helmet, gloves, goggles, and sun protection. And it's tempting to put two pairs of socks on, but this won't stop your children from feeling the cold - it actually stops blood circulation and limits sensitivity in their feet.

## Is it better to buy or hire their gear?

Most people hire clothing, buy second-hand or borrow from friends as it gets expensive when you need to size-up each year. And in terms of equipment, it's always better to hire boots and skis. Height and weight change the length of your skis - we all know that children shoot up every year.

## **LA PLAGNE** Paradiski

Best for: Variety

> Transfer: 3hrs 30mins - Geneva

- Choose between villages, from Plagne Centre in the middle of it all, to quieter hamlets like Plagne 1800.
- Huge, high-altitude ski area that's full of variety and home to France's longest fun slope.
- Visit the magical ice grotto up on the glacier.
- If you've got area lift passes, catch the double-decker cable car over to ski in Les Arcs.



**LES ARCS** 

- Several ski-in, ski-out villages, each with their own look and feel.
- Everything from tree-lined trails to open, bowl-shaped slopes and an excellent snow park - so you'll have tons to do, whatever your ability.
- Catch the cable car over to La Plagne to explore the other half of the 425km Paradiski area.
- Off the slopes, visit France's biggest Igloo Village or whizz down water slides at the Mile8 leisure centre.

## **TIGNES**

Tignes-Val d'Isère

Best for: High-altitude skiing

> Transfer: 4hrs - Geneva

- Purpose-built villages with plenty of activities like swimming and tubing.
- On the mountain, the high altitude makes for great snow conditions.
- Practise on nursery slopes in Le Lac and Val Claret villages, then follow the gentle blues down to Les Brévières.
- Little thrill-seekers can do their first tricks at the Gliss'Park.

- Different levels of run lead back to one central point, so it's easy for mixed-ability groups to meet for lunch.
- Get together for ice skating, ice karting or bowling after a day on the mountain.





## **MAKE A SPLASH**

A trip to the pool is usually a crowdpleaser, and if your hotel doesn't have one, loads of resorts have somewhere to take a dip. Near Zell am See, Austria, the Tauern Spa has saunas and steam rooms galore, as well as a special kids' area with slides and a baby pool.



## **FUN FOR THRILL-SEEKERS**

Zoom down eight different ziplines at the Cascade de Tyrolienne in La Plagne, France. For some more high-speed action, visit the resort's Olympic bobsleigh track - climb aboard a self-guided four-person bob raft or join an instructor to experience the course with a pro, hurtling around 19 bends and reaching speeds of 120km/h. Over in Tignes, France the Bun J Ride is not for the faint of heart either. Experienced skiers aged 14 and over can whizz down a ski jump attached to two bungee ropes, then fly through the air before bouncing gently onto the snow below. And in Flaine, France test your driving skills on the ice karting circuit, which also has child karts so younger ones can get involved too.







## **INDOOR ACTIVITIES**

Have some après fun in **Flaine**, **France** and visit Galaxy Bowling, where there are six bowling lanes, a games room and pool tables. **St Anton**, **Austria** is a favourite for families with older children. The arl.rock sports centre has a climbing gym, as well as a sports bar with skittles and plenty of pub games. For a team challenge, try Arlberg Escapes – collect clues and crack codes to escape a locked room in under an hour. It's outside the centre of St Anton, but the free ski bus will get you there in 10 minutes.





## **MOUNTAIN MEALS**

There's nothing quite like a meal in the mountains. Gather around a pot of bubbling cheese fondue in France or share a plate of kaiserschmarrn – that's a chopped pancake – in Austria. When in Italy, you can't beat a round of authentic pizzas and bowls piled high with homemade spaghetti. And who can resist a post ski school treat with a view? Hot choc moustaches here we come.


